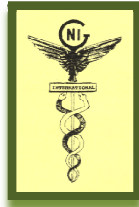

After a successful career working for a large telecoms company Elizabeth decided to change direction and focus on helping people. Her interest in Iridology began by chance when she overheard a conversation on the topic. She studied with Peter Jackson-Main and to complement Iridology took a separate course in Naturopathic Nutritional Therapy.

Elizabeth has been practising Human Iridology, Nutritional Therapy and Food Intolerance testing since 2003, adding Equine Iridology, Sclerology and Behavioural/Personality Iridology in subsequent years.

Based near Ely, Cambridgeshire, Elizabeth works from several clinics in East Anglia. She regularly gives talks to local groups and lectures annually to 300 Cambridge University medical students on Iridology and complementary health in general.

Elizabeth is committed to improving health by assessing the strengths and weaknesses of the individual using Iridology along with nutritional therapy as a therapeutic protocol. Her aim is to empower and educate individuals so that they can enhance their own good health.

Sclerology – Lines and Markings

Madelene McConomy FGNI, MBRI, NIRA, IIST



Madelene was first introduced to Iridology by a friend in 1976 who gave her a booklet called Irisdiagnosis Notes by Dr Ralph R Weiss, published in 1949. There were no pictures and, therefore, it was difficult to comprehend at the time but it contained some very advanced facts. Some years later at a psychic & healing fair a lady was doing Iridology readings and it grabbed her attention. She told Madelene had an ovarian cyst – which was proven to be true.

This started Madelene's path to Iridology in 1986. She enrolled into the Bournemouth School but changed to the British School of Iridology in Cambridge, receiving her Master Iridology Diploma in 1990. She became a Fellow of the Guild in 1997 and has been involved in the development of the Guild over the years.

To enhance her Iridology skills, Madelene studied both Sclerology and Personality Iridology with Leonard Mehlmauer ND. She considers that by incorporating them into her practice it allows her to see a more complete picture of the individual. During her talk Madelene will show us how we can interpret lines and markings found on the sclera.

Masterclass

Sue McGarrigle of Bionutri will present a short masterclass on the topic of DHA, the Omega-3 fatty acid. Most fish oil supplements have traditionally supplied an Omega-3 ratio that favours EPA to DHA but as practitioners use increasingly higher recommendations of total Omega-3 intake Sue will explain the important pathway by which DHA metabolism in the liver may be reduced by competition from EPA.
